Since 1993 (while at RTI), Dr. Dennis has worked to integrate measurement, clinical research, and practice through the development of the Global Appraisal of Individual Needs (GAIN) family of measures. Since 2003, the GAIN Coordinating Center (www.gaincc.org) that I direct has gone even further by working with over 17,220 staff from 5,155 agencies (in all 50 states in the US, all 10 provinces of Canada, and 11 other countries). The GAINCC teach clinical staff how to utilize the GAIN measures to support clinical decision making related to diagnosis, treatment planning, placement, outcome monitoring, and program/policy planning. It provides a cloud based set of software tools to collect the data, score it and generate reports in both tabular and narrative form. The latter incorporates diagnostic recommendations based on DSM-5, placement recommendations based on ASAM, and treatment planning recommendations based on research evidence where available and, otherwise, consensus built across the collaborating systems of care. The GAIN instruments, manuals, scales scoring algorithms, validation working papers and detailed norms (n=100,000) are publically available for free on our website. Through 2019, over 5 dozen clinical and measurement /statistical researchers have published 563 publications through 2019 have used GAIN data. This includes developing shorter versions of the GAIN and guidance to clinical researcher building on methodological work. The significance of this work led to my receiving the International Council on Alcoholism and Addiction (ICAA) lifetime achievement award for my work with the GAIN.

Through six research centers (RC), and one Coordinating Center (CC), the NIDA TRIALS cooperative seeks to improve the continuum of evidence-based services including HIV prevention available to youth within the juvenile justice system. The Coordinating Center's AIMS are to: 1) conduct a national survey of juvenile justice agencies that provides a context and comparison standard for the TRIALS pre-implementation needs assessment and subsequent implementation studies; 2) coordinate each Research Center's pre-implementation

needs assessment; 3) develop and manage a common data base infrastructure for cross-site Research Implementation Studies, and 4) Provide state-of-the-art communications and logistical support for the steering committee, workgroups, training activities and data safety monitoring board.

Using Smartphones to Provide Recovery Support Services. The aims of this trial are to examine the effect of combining more frequent self-monitoring via Ecological Momentary Assessments (EMAs) and automated interventions via Ecological Momentary Interventions (EMIs) provided by A-CHESS on days of abstinence from drugs and alcohol and HIV risk behaviors over 6 months following treatment discharge. We will recruit 400 participants at discharge (both planned or unplanned) from Illinois' largest treatment organization and randomly assign them in a 2 x 2 factorial design to receive EMA only, EMI only, combined EMA+EMI, or neither (control). Participants in the 3 EMA and EMI groups will receive a smartphone and training after discharge. To help them self-monitor, individuals in the EMA groups will be randomly signaled 6 times daily for 6 months and asked to record their recent substance use, HIV risk behaviors (e.g., needle use, unprotected sex) and exposure to internal and external protective and risk factors, then to rate the extent to which these factors support their recovery or make them want to use drugs or alcohol. Individuals in the EMI groups will have 24/7 access to A-CHESS. In the combined EMA+EMI group, participants will receive feedback directly following completion of each 2-3 minute EMA, and EMA responses will be used to encourage EMI utilization. The AIMS of this experiment are to: Aim 1. Test the effect of EMA, EMI and EMA+EMI on days of abstinence; Aim 2. Test the effect of EMA, EMI and EMA+EMI on HIV risk behaviors; and Aim 3. Evaluate the extent to which changes in days of abstinence mediate the effect of EMA, EMI, and EMA+EMI on HIV risk behaviors.

Recovery Management Checkup for Primary Care (RMC-PC) vs. Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) Experiment. The aims of this trial are to 1) recruit 300 adult patients with SUD through SBIRT programs operating in 5 sites operated by 3 FQHC organizations; 2) randomly assign half to a referral as usual control and half to RMC-PC; and 3) conduct quarterly follow-ups for 12-months post enrollment. Hypotheses include: H1 Relative to the control patients, RMC-PC patients will be more likely to initiate AOD treatment sooner, receive any AOD treatment, and receive more days of AOD treatment; H2 Relative to the control patients, RMC-PC patients and those who receive more AOD treatment will report fewer days of heavy alcohol use, other drug use, any AOD use and SUD problems; H3 The days of treatment will mediate the relationship between RMC-PC and changes in the pre and post measures of these AOD related behaviors; H4 Relative to the control patients, RMC-PC patients and those with fewer days of AOD use will have significantly less total health care utilization costs after factoring in increases in AOD treatment; and H5 The days of AOD use will mediate the relationship between RMC-PC and the cost of health care utilization.

Smartphone Addiction Recovery Coach for Young Adults (SARC-YA) Experiment. Young adults will be recruited upon their discharge from outpatient treatment programs and randomly assigned to either a recovery support as usual control or a 6-month SARC experimental condition with Ecological Momentary Assessments (EMA) and Ecological Momentary Interventions (EMI). Data include standardized assessments, urine tests, mobile phone metadata, EMA responses, and EMI utilization. Study hypotheses will be tested using survival analysis, multi-level modeling and structural equation

modeling of longitudinal data. The aims of this experiment are to: 1) test the effects of SARC (v control) on the frequency of substance use; 2) evaluate the extent to which the above effects are moderated by baseline substance use frequency; 3) test the extent to which the frequency of substance use mediates the effects of SARC on other aspects of recovery including SUD symptoms, HIV risk behavior, quality of life, mental wellness, days of school; and 4) determine the degree to which EMA responses and EMI utilization predict the duration of abstinence.

E-Connect: Recovery I A service system intervention for justice youth at risk for suicide.

The project specific aims are (1) to develop a technologically advanced cross-system identification/linkage service model that trains staff, formalizes interagency collaboration and referral decision-making and uses a mobile application to seamlessly combine (a) screening for SB and related BH problems, (b) classification of clinical need and (c) county-specific streamlined referral plans for BH services; (2) to examine the degree to which, compared to Baseline, e- Connect improves (a) intermediary PO practice outcomes (service need identification, cross-system referral) and increasing (b) youth BH service use (access, engagement); and (3) to elucidate multi-level factors (e.g., staff, organizational, youth/family, community,) that influence implementation (feasibility, acceptability, sustainability) of e-Connect across various probation department processing categories (e.g. status offenders, diversion cases) to inform comprehensive scale-up. This 5-year study will comprise 4 project phases: (1) Development, (2) Baseline data collection, (3) Implementation, and (4) Sustainment. After development, counties are randomized to one of 4 Waves to begin implementation of e-Connect at 4-month intervals in a stepped-wedge design. Implementation activities continue for 18m and sites' use of e-Connect protocols after 18m will be an indication of sustainability.

Recovery Initiation and Management after Overdose (RIMO) Experiment. This study targets individuals in Chicago who have received naloxone administered by first responders within the past week to reverse an overdose, but who have not entered into MAT. Participants will be randomly assigned to the control group, i.e., referral as usual to treatment, or to Recovery Initiation and Management after Overdose (RIMO), an assertive linkage and recovery support intervention. This intervention builds on an evidence-based intervention for treatment linkage, monitoring, and recovery support evaluated in 3 prior clinical trials.

Cross-site Evaluation of OJJDP Juvenile Drug Treatment Court Guidelines. Under a subcontract to the American Institutes of Research (AIR), Chestnut is leading a team to evaluate the OJJDP (2016) JDTC guidelines in approximately 15 sites across the U.S. using a combination of randomized experiments and regression discontinuity designs to assign youth to JDTC vs. traditional juvenile courts.

Improving Retention across the OUD Service Cascade upon Reentry from Jail using Recovery Management Checkups Experiment. The proposed experiment will test an adapted version of an evidence-based intervention, the Recovery Management Checkups (RMC) model, which provides quarterly check-ups and assistance with treatment retention and re-linkage as indicated at the quarterly check-ups. The RMC-Adaptive will adjust the frequency and intensity of check-ups based on the individual's assessed need for treatment, thereby reducing (or lengthening) the time between check-ups for those with (or without) indicators of treatment need.

CT-SAFE Service Cascade CTDCF has contracted with the GAIN Coordinating Center for GAIN and GAIN ABS licensing, training, data services, evaluation reports and software development activities for many years. As part of our ongoing work, CTDCF is funding program evaluation of its SAFE Family Recovery (SAFE-FR) project. SAFE-FR is comprised of three evidence-based practices to promote engagement with substance use treatment: Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT), Multidimensional Family Recovery (MDFR) and Recovery Management Checkups and Support (RMCS). In collaboration with the state, the vendor for each service, and local providers, GCC staff are evaluating each program to identify potential gaps in their service cascade (i.e., the flow of clients from screening and need identification through referral, treatment initiation, and retention / continuing care). Based on analysis of the service cascade, the evaluation examines client and staff factors contributing to gaps, differences among vendors, and the impact of external forces like COVID. This culminates in a report including recommendations for how to further improve program functioning and data systems.

Chicago Opioid Overdose Recovery Project (COORP) City of Chicago Police Department. Through the use of grant funds, Chicago Police Department (CPD) will train and equip patrol officers and Chicago Fire Department (CFD) Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) to carry / administer naloxone to reverse opioid overdoses, improve linkage mechanisms connecting overdose victims to treatment services, and collaborate with stakeholders to identify issues and implement solutions along the opioid continuum.

Development of the GAIN Q4 CTDCF has contracted with the GAIN Coordinating Center for GAIN and GAIN ABS licensing, training, data services, evaluation reports and software development activities for many years. As part of our ongoing work, CTDCF is funding analysis and software development activities to re-develop the GAIN-Q3 to support diagnosis and ASAM level of care placement. Analysis was conducted to 1) assess how well the GAIN-Q3 predicts substance use disorder diagnoses using fewer items than those in the GAIN-I (which uses the full diagnostic criteria from DSM 5) and 2) to assess which items from the GAIN-I were needed to support ASAM level of care placement. The resulting new instrument, the GAIN-Q4, would meet GAIN customer needs by requiring significantly less time to administer than the GAIN-I while still supporting common diagnoses related to SUD (alcohol, cannabis, opioid, stimulant, other), internalizing disorders/problems (mood, anxiety, trauma, suicide, and psychosis), externalizing disorders (attention deficit, hyperactivity, conduct, gambling), and crime/violence (domestic violence, substance, property and violent crimes). It also provides additional input to support level of care placement per ASAM's required dimensions (withdrawal management, physical health, mental health, readiness to change, relapse potential and recovery environment), as well as family functioning and wellbeing.
